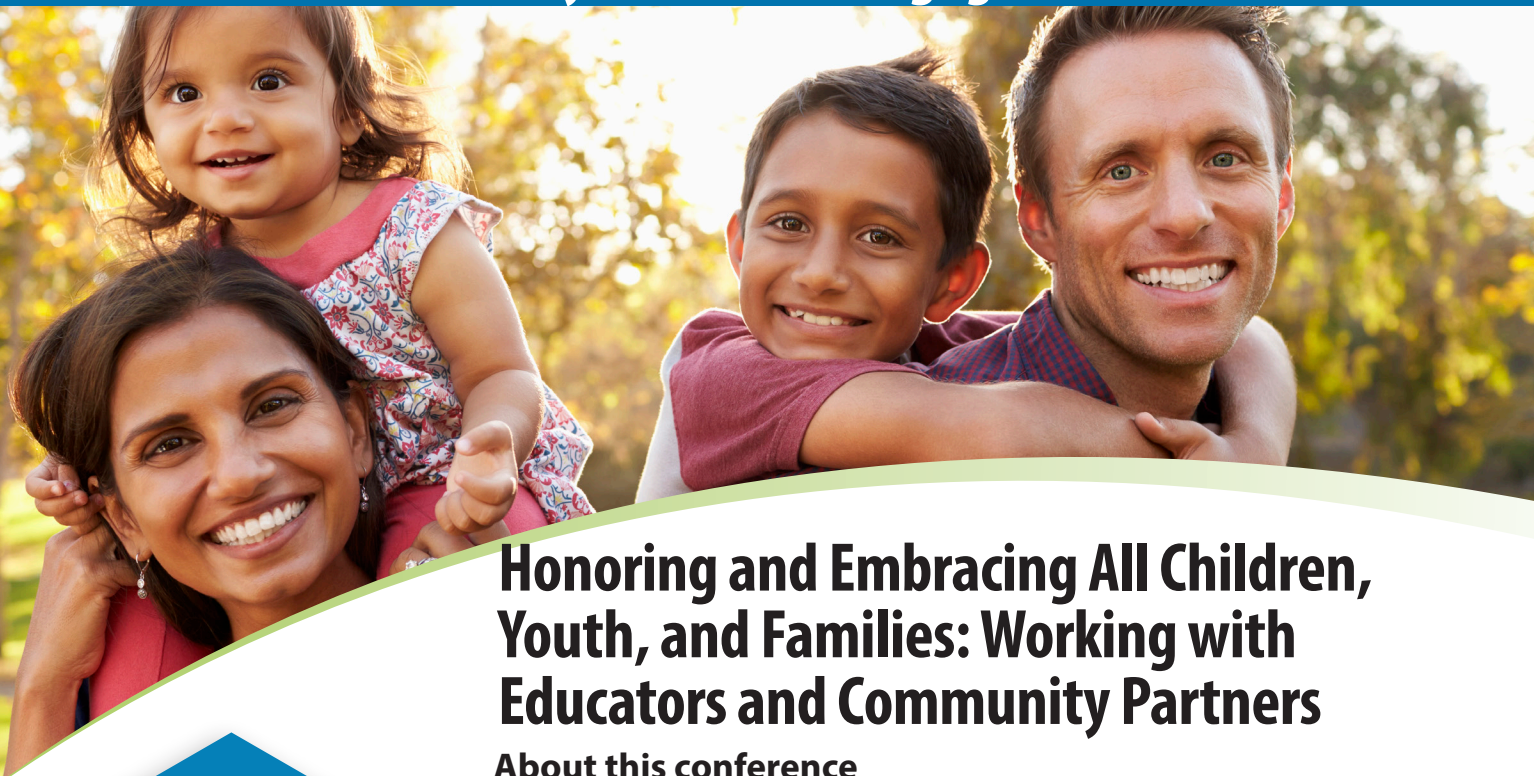


# CREC's 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Family and School Engagement Conference
