

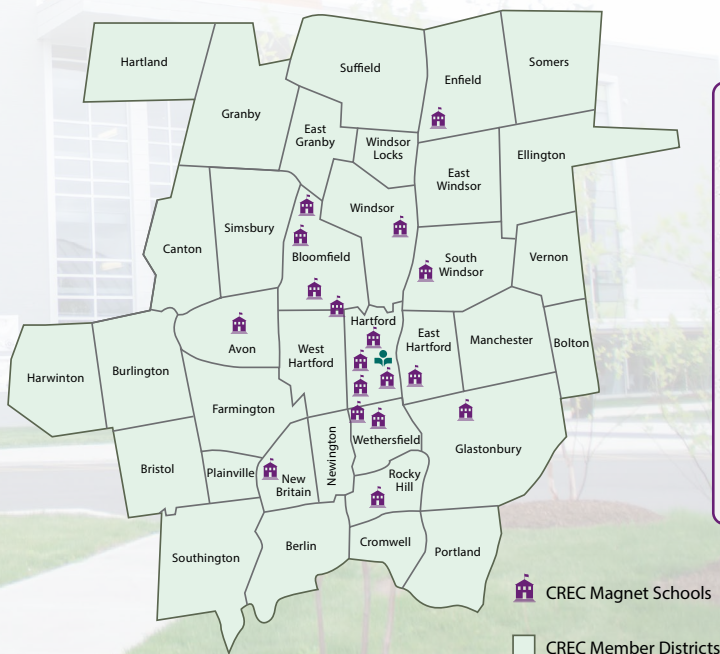
2025 CREC LEGISLATIVE Priorities



MAGNET SCHOOL FUNDING REQUEST:

Fully fund the student-centered-funding model, partially implemented in FY25 at \$40.2M for RESC Magnet Schools, benefiting all CT districts and schools including the 16 Sheff magnet schools and two programs, managed by CREC, serving 9,000+ urban and suburban students.

- If full funding is not feasible, an incremental increase toward full funding should be considered.
- If there is no change to the 2025 funding level, legislation removing the 58% local district tuition cap must occur to enable CREC, a non-taxing entity as a RESC, to address rising costs and ensure quality education for all students.



BONDING REQUESTS:

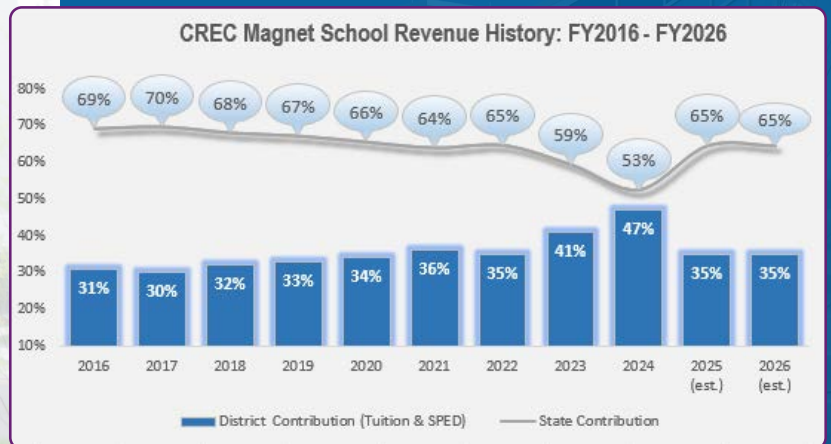
Request \$19 million in bonding for capital improvements for magnet schools managed by CREC in the Sheff Region.

To support the state's obligations for Sheff v. O'Neill, the state asked CREC to create a school system with 16 magnet schools; however, as a RESC, CREC does not have bonding authority for capital improvements as available to a traditional school district

PA 22-118 formalized a mechanism for state bonding to cover the capital improvement necessities for the 16 Sheff magnet schools operated by CREC requiring CREC to adopt a long-range capital improvement plan and school building project priorities list submitted to DAS and CGA.

- In June 2023, the Bond Commission approved \$10M for capital improvement projects, which are substantially completed at four schools for projects such as roofing, sidewalks, and parking lots.

Currently, five (5) of the 16 CREC magnet schools are nearly 25 years old.
